Jose L. Zamorano is Professor of Medicine at the University Alcalá de Henares, Madrid, Spain, and the Chief of Cardiology at the University Hospital Ramón y Cajal, Spain.



Professor Zamorano obtained his medical degree from the University Complutense in 1987 and his Doctor of Medicine in 1991. He received his board certification in cardiology in 1993 before joining the Complutense University as an Associate Professor.

Professor Zamorano has served as Secretary of the European Society of Cardiology (ESC), President of the European Association of Echocardiography, International Advisor of the American College of Cardiology's International Committee, Director of the scientific programme in imaging for the ESC Congress, and member of the Practice Guidelines Committee of the ESC and Vicepresident ESC.

Over the past 20 years, Professor Zamorano has received a number of prestigious awards, including the Golden Plaque of the Public Health Authorities of Madrid and the Ingel Edler Gold Medal, the Silver Medal of the ESC and the Research Award of the Spanish Society of Cardiology. He has served on numerous editorial boards of journals and is currently Associate Editor of the *European Journal of Cardiovascular Imaging*.

Professor Zamorano has a broad range of research interests including heart failure, ischaemic heart disease, cardiovascular risk factors and cardiovascular imaging modalities. Within these fields, he has published over 700 articles and 20 books, including the European Textbook of Cardiovascular Imaging. His impact factor is over 1500 and he has a Hirsch Index of 117, with more than 100,000 citations.
